Investment Strategy

- The Trust seeks to achieve its investment objective by holding the Portfolio, with the weight of each stock in the Portfolio substantially corresponding to the weight of such stock in the DJIA. As used in the Prospectus, the term "Portfolio Securities" refers to the common stocks that are actually held by the Trust and make up the Trust's Portfolio, while the term "Index Securities" refers to the common stocks that are included in the DJIA, as determined by the index provider, S&P Dow Jones Indices LLC ("S&P").
- At any time, the Portfolio will consist of as many of the Index Securities as is practicable. To maintain the correspondence between the composition and weightings of Portfolio Securities and Index Securities, the Trustee adjusts the Portfolio from time to time to conform to periodic changes made by S&P to the identity and/or relative weightings of Index Securities in the DJIA. The Trustee or SSBT generally makes these adjustments to the Portfolio within three (3) Business Days before or after the day on which changes in the DJIA are scheduled to take effect. Although the Trust may fail to own certain Index Securities at any particular time, the Trust generally will be substantially invested in Index Securities, which should result in a close correspondence between the performance of the DJIA and the performance of the Trust.

Market and Credit Risks

- Index Tracking Risk. While the Trust is intended to track the performance of the DJIA as closely as possible, the Trust's return may not match or achieve a high degree of correlation with the return of the DJIA due to expenses and transaction costs incurred in adjusting the Portfolio. In addition, it is possible that the Trust may not always fully replicate the performance of the DJIA due to the unavailability of certain Index Securities in the secondary market or due to other extraordinary circumstances (e.g., if trading in a certain security has been halted). In addition, the Trust's portfolio may deviate from the DJIA to the extent required to ensure continued qualification as a "regulated investment company" under Subchapter M of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- Equity Investing and Market Risk. An investment in the Trust involves risks similar to those of investing in any fund of equity securities, such as market fluctuations caused by such factors as economic and political developments, changes in interest rates, perceived trends in securities prices, war, acts of terrorism, the spread of infectious disease or other public health issues. Local, regional or global events could have a significant impact on the Trust and its investments and could result in increased premiums or discounts to the Trust's net asset value. An investment in the Trust is subject to the risks of any investment in a portfolio of large-capitalization common stocks, including the risk that the general level of stock prices may decline, thereby adversely affecting the value of such investment. The value of Portfolio Securities may fluctuate in accordance with changes in the financial condition of the issuers of Portfolio Securities, the value of common stocks generally and other factors. The identity and weighting of Index Securities and the Portfolio Securities change from time to time. The financial condition of issuers of Portfolio Securities may become impaired or the general condition of the stock market may deteriorate, either of which may cause a decrease in the value of the Portfolio and thus in the value of Units. Equity securities are susceptible to general stock market fluctuations and to volatile increases and decreases in value as market confidence in and perceptions of their issuers change. An outbreak of infectious respiratory illness caused by a novel coronavirus known as COVID-19 was first detected in China in December 2019 and was declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization in March 2020. The impact of COVID-19, and other infectious disease outbreaks that may arise in the future, could adversely affect the economies of many nations or the entire global economy, individual issuers and capital markets in ways that cannot necessarily be foreseen. The Trust may have significant investments in one or more specific industries, sectors or issuers subjecting it to risks greater than general market risk.
- Fluctuation of the Net Asset Value per Unit ("NAV"); Unit Premiums and Discounts. The NAV of the Units will generally fluctuate with changes in the market value of the Trust's securities holdings. The market price of the Units will generally fluctuate in accordance with changes in the Trust's NAV and supply and demand for the Units on NYSE Arca, Inc. or any other exchange on which Units are traded. Price differences may be due, in large part, to the fact that supply and demand forces at work in the secondary trading market for Units will be closely related to, but not identical to, the same forces influencing the prices of the Index Securities trading individually or in the aggregate at any point in time. The market price of Units may deviate significantly from the NAV of the Units during periods of market volatility. While the Trust's creation/redemption feature is designed to make it likely that Units normally will trade close to the Trust's NAV, disruptions to creations and redemptions and/or market volatility may result in trading prices for Units that differ significantly from NAV. If an investor purchases Units at a time when the market price is at a premium to the NAV of the Units or sells at a time when the market

price is at a discount to the NAV of the Units, then the investor may sustain losses that are in addition to any losses caused by a decrease in NAV

• Exchange Risk. Units traded on the SGX-ST are denominated and traded in U.S. dollars. Units may only be created or redeemed in U.S. dollars. To the extent a Singapore investor wishes to convert U.S. dollar holdings or distributions to Singapore dollars, fluctuations in exchange rates may affect the value of the proceeds following a conversion.

- Passive Strategy/Index Risk. The Trust is not actively managed. Rather, the Trust attempts to track the performance of an unmanaged index of securities. This differs from an actively managed fund, which typically seeks to outperform a benchmark index. As a result, the Trust will hold constituent securities of the DJIA regardless of the current or projected performance of a specific security or a particular industry or market sector, which could cause the Trust's return to be lower than if the Trust employed an active strategy.
- Large Cap Risk. The Portfolio Securities are expected to consist of equity securities of large-capitalization U.S. issuers. Returns on investments in stocks of large U.S. companies could trail the returns on investments in stocks of smaller and mid-sized companies.
